- 1** **Domaine Du Tariquet 2013 Classic / Côtes de Gascogne. Blend** –A charcuterie board pairs well with this wine especially if the selections include smoked Gouda, lamb, and apricots. Superbly intense for a dry fruity white, its nose reveals floral and citrus aromas with nice touches of tropical fruit. \$8. Try with Thai Food. At this price point you can afford the corkage fee, so take to your favorite restaurant. Côtes de Gascogne is a designated wine-producing zone in the Armagnac region of Southwest France. Known in English as Gascony, the picturesque country features textured green vistas, medieval towns, sunny skies, and far-off views of the Pyrenees Mountains. With its rich agriculture and rolling hills, this area is often called the Tuscany of France.
